Community



A social group of any size whose members reside in a specific locality, share government, and often have a cultural heritage







Police

An organized civil force for maintaining order, preventing and detecting crime, and enforcing the laws

Community Policing

The assigning of the same police officers to a particular area so that they become familiar with the residents and the residents with them, as a way of reducing crime

1829

Sir Robert Peel established the
Metropolitan Police Services in
London

Policing Principles

The basic mission for which the police exist is to prevent crime and disorder

The ability of the police to perform their duties is dependent upon public approval of police actions

Policing Principles

Police must secure the willing co-operation of the public in voluntary observance of the law to be able to secure and maintain the respect of the public

Policing Principles

The degree of co-operation of the public that can be secured diminishes proportionately to the necessity of the use of physical force

Police are the public and the Public are the Police
